



ERASMUS+ KA131 financial support

In general, all BTU students who have been accepted for an Erasmus+ study place by the International Relations Office receive ERASMUS+ financial support.

The Condition to this is that the student is enrolled in a degree programme in Germany, which will lead to a recognized qualification, and has already completed at least one academic year of said degree programme.

The amount of funding depends on the different costs of living in the destination countries. The following funding levels apply throughout Germany for study abroad¹:

Country group	Destination	monthly allowance
Group 1	Austria, Belgium, Denmark, Finland, France, Ireland, Iceland, Italy, Liechtenstein, Luxembourg, Netherlands, Norway, Sweden	600 Euro
Group 2 + Group 3	Bulgaria, Croatia, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Estonia, Greece, Hungary, Latvia, Lithuania, Malta, North Macedonia, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Serbia, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Turkey	540 Euro

Travel Support

Since the Erasmus+ Project 2025, all Erasmus+ grant recipients receive a travel allowance, based on the geographical distance between home university and partner institution.

The <u>EU Distance Calculator</u> is used to determine the distance. As the starting point, the location of your home university is used.

Additional funding: Top up

Additional funding of **EUR 250 / month** is possible for participants with fewer opportunities:

Additional funding: travel support & travel days

Since the Erasmus+ Project 2025, all Erasmus+ grant recipients receive a travel allowance, based on the geographical distance between home university and partner institution.

Financial support is also available for **up to 2** additional travel days to cover the costs of the outward and return journey and for **up to 6** additional travel days in the case of green travel:

Students who have already received ERASMUS+ funding during their Bachelor's studies can also apply a second time for a place on a Master's and/or doctoral programme. The period must be counted towards the total possible funding period of 12 months per study phase.

The ERASMUS+ grant is paid out in two instalments:

- o a first instalment of 80% of the total amount at the beginning of the study abroad period and
- a second instalment of 20% of the funding amount after your return, once all the necessary documents have been submitted.

The ERASMUS+ coordinators at the International Relations Office will inform you about all the necessary steps and formalities before and during your semester abroad.
