



Leaflet ERASMUS+ Financial Support

Take advantage of offered funding for your semester abroad!

In general, all participants of the ERASMUS + study abroad programme will receive financial support intended for related costs in a foreign country. Condition to this is that the student is enrolled in a degree programme in Germany, which will lead to a recognized qualification and has already completed at least one academic year of said degree programme.

The amount of funding is based on the different costs of living in the host countries. German wide the following amount of funding is used:

Group 1 (450 euros per month): Denmark, Finland, Iceland, Ireland, Liechtenstein, Luxembourg, Norway, Sweden, United Kingdom

Group 2 (390 euros a month): Austria, Belgium, Cyprus, France, Greece, Italy, Malta, Netherlands, Spain, Portugal.

Group 3 (330 euros per month): Bulgaria, Croatia, Czech Republic, Estonia, Latvia, Lithuania, the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia, Poland, Romania, Slovakia, Slovenia, Hungary, Turkey.

The disbursement of funding is generally paid out in two instalments: at the beginning of the study abroad and after returning in the presence of all necessary documents.

The ERASMUS+ coordinators at the International Relations Office of the BTU Cottbus – Senftenberg will inform you before and during your semester abroad about all the necessary steps and formalities.

Special support for students with special needs

- **Students with disabilities** may receive an allowance for additional costs in the context of an ERASMUS+ term abroad. In such as case, please contact the Coordinator of the ERASMUS+ Student Mobility at the International Relations Office of the BTU Cottbus - Senftenberg, Ms. Karin Robel.
