We are looking for a person with strong research skills and teaching experience. The candidate will work closely with the Centre for Law and Administrative Sciences (ZfRV) at the BTU Cottbus–Senftenberg and will continue the research and teaching connections established by the Centre, especially in social work law.

The selected candidate should have relevant publications in high-ranking legal journals. The focus of the professorship is on social law, in particular social welfare law and child and youth welfare law, as well as criminal law and or labour law. The willingness to engage in scientific networking within the university, especially with the institutes of economics and social work is expected. In addition to the above, active participation in the ZfRV and research projects on sustainable socio-technical transformation and structural change in Lusatia is required. International research activities and international networking are also desirable. Experience in the acquisition and realization of third-party funded projects is expected. Fields of research should be relevant for the DFG (German Research Foundation) or similar international research funding organisations.

The teaching duties are in the study programmes of social work and the study programmes of Faculty 5. It is expected that the societal and social references of law are clarified within the scope of this activity. For example, by considering aspects of inclusion, equality, diversity, or distributive justice. Furthermore, the willingness to use contemporary didactic methods is anticipated. Lectures are primarily to be held in German, fluency in English is expected.

In the context of academic self-administration, the candidate is expected to be actively involved, also in a leading role, in the social work degree programmes, which will be consolidated through dual membership in Faculty 4 in addition to Faculty 5.
