Beddawi at the Edge of a City

Beddawi is located on the northern edge of Tripoli in northern Lebanon. It is composed of a mixture of fragmented urban forms (camps, informal settlements, historic fabrics, sprawl) that were affected and produced by different environmental catastrophes, political crises and social transformations. This is also a landscape of social ruptures, high sectarian tensions and precarious forms of citizenship that exists within the various residents of this territory: squatters and internally displaced Lebanese, the different historic communities that resided in Beddawi, and the different forms of historic and recent refugees.

The aim of the workshop is to develop a spatial vision and strategic interventions, projects and insights for Beddawi as an attempt to address the various social, political and spatial ruptures that fragment this territory. This workshop will build on two years of community participation and research conducted in the Palestinian refugee camp of Beddawi and its adjacent areas. The output of the workshop will produce a variety of visual materials and guidelines that will be eventually presented to the various communities in the Beddawi Area in the form of exhibitions and publications.
