After the success of the previous 3 editions (held in Kerkrade). The Centre of Research for Smart Urban ReDesign (SURD) is organizing the fourth edition of the (re)CYCLE LIMBURG design workshop on revitalization of public space, which takes place from November 18 till 22, 2019 in Maatricht

The focus will be on 2 locations in Maastricht city. Building on experiences and insights from the previous workshops and we will be developing new concepts and designs for the 2 locations through participatory approach We will be to investigating together the role and meaning of the so called "public" spaces, testing if and how these spaces can be a catalyst for future cycles that promote social cohesion, healthy lifestyle and well-being.

### **#Organization:**

- · Activate the engagement of the local community by co-production processes.
- · Promote projects that facilitate economic, socio-cultural revival and a local sense of community.
